SMHF staff were thrilled to celebrate the lasting partnership between Wray's Pharmacy and Stevenson Memorial Hospital (SMH).

"It's going to take everyone to help us reach our goal, and we thank local businesses such as Wray's Pharmacy who have supported us and made a contribution during this challenging year."

In October, 2019 the Stevenson Memorial Hospital Foundation launched a \$43 million Capital Campaign, *Because of you, we can*, in support of the Hospital's redevelopment project, as well as critical equipment and technology upgrades. Of their goal, \$30 million represents the community share of the funds required to be raised for the \$167 million project. The Hospital relies on the support of the community for enhancements to infrastructure, equipment and technology, as the government does not provide annual funding for these critical needs.

SMH's redevelopment project includes a revitalized Emergency Department, doubling the square footage of the Hospital and tripling the amount of parking space. Refreshed outpatient rooms, birthing suites and laboratory space are also included in the plans.
