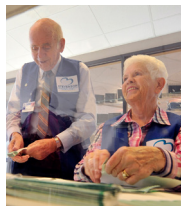
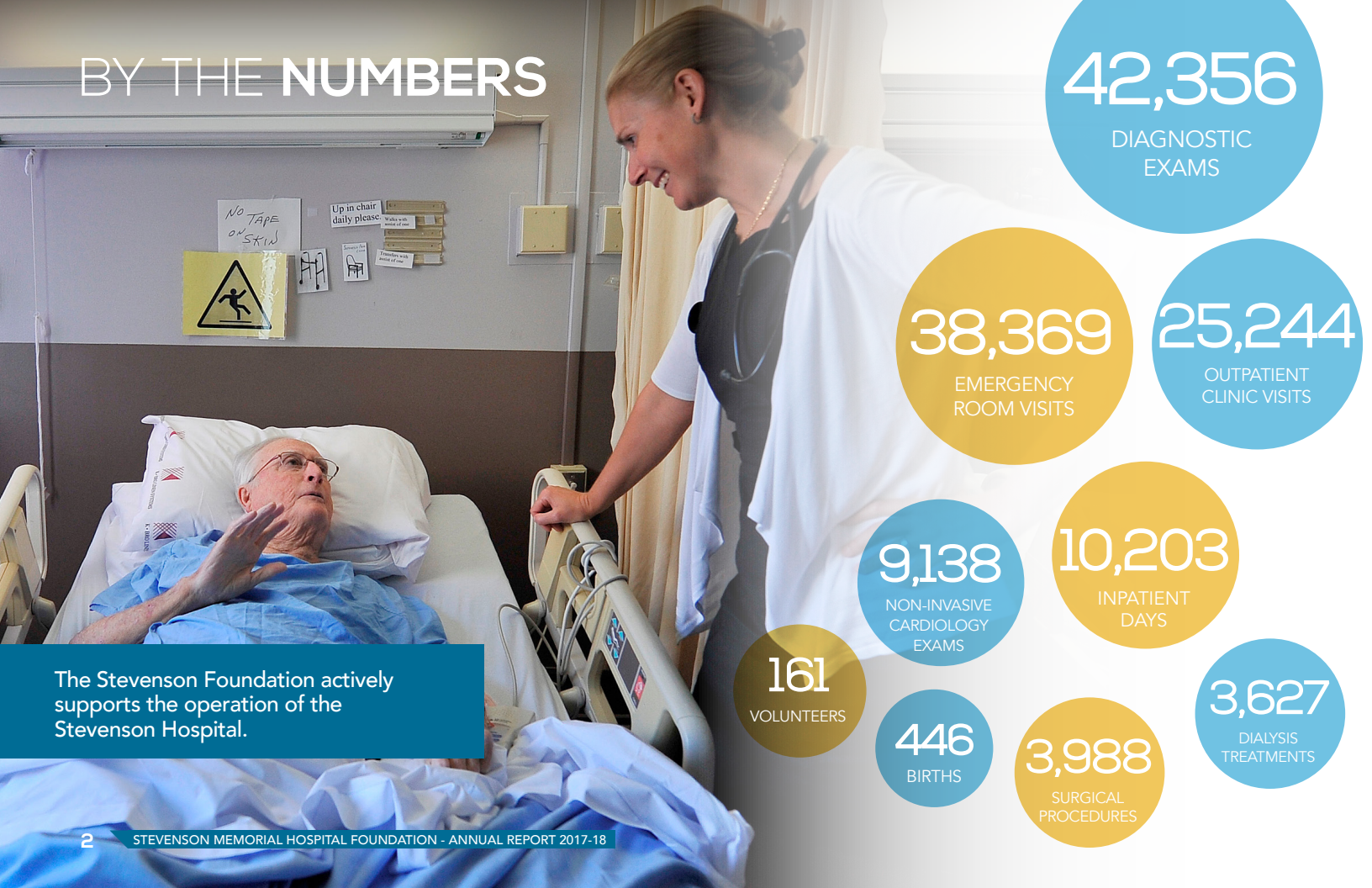

A message from Margaret Barber, Board Chairperson
and Tanya Wall, Executive Director

Your generosity is the strength behind our care and we are deeply grateful to our donors, supporters, sponsors and community partners for helping to make 2017-2018 a record-breaking year for our hospital and our community.

Thanks to the commitment and generosity of caring donors like you, we raised **\$2.1M last year** to support annual priority needs, including critical equipment, technology and redevelopment planning. Half a million dollars was invested in a new state-of-the-art Health Information System (HIS) at Stevenson, part of an overall commitment to raise \$5M for the implementation of the HIS from the Foundation.

Since we launched the Transforming Stevenson Campaign in April 2017, donors have committed over **\$17M in received gifts and future pledges**. This includes gifts towards priority annual equipment, a state-of-the-art new HIS and the redevelopment.

This outstanding level of support is essential in ensuring that Stevenson is equipped to respond to patients' needs in the present, as well as preparing for the future. The community that Stevenson serves continues to grow, and with that comes increased pressure on the hospital. Since the Government does not provide funds for the ongoing capital equipment costs, the



support of the community is the determining factor in the hospital's ability to purchase updated, modernized, life-saving equipment.

We are grateful to the many businesses, corporate partners, individuals, and not-for-profit groups who gave so generously throughout the past year.

Together we will continue to transform care in our community, now and for generations to come.

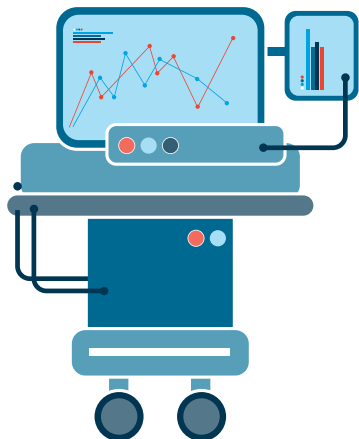

YOUR DOLLARS AT WORK



▲ \$2.4M was raised last year in received gifts and future pledges to support annual priority needs, including critical equipment.

Some of the essential equipment purchased includes:

- 45 smart infusion pumps to be used throughout the hospital.
- A surgical headlamp for the Operating Room (OR) that is primarily used by the Obstetrics department for cancer screening and detection.
- A new electrosurgical unit for the Operating Room that enables digitally controlled incisions during surgery, decreasing blood loss and improving patient outcomes.
- Beds, bedside tables and overbed tables in the Medical-Surgical Unit as part of our ongoing Refurbish a Room Campaign.
- A BiliBlanket™ for the Obstetrics Department, a portable phototherapy device for the treatment of neonatal jaundice.



Many donors, including private foundations, committed more than \$1M this year toward a new Health Information System (HIS)

Here is why HIS is one of the hospital's most critical needs and how your support of this important initiative is revolutionizing health care at Stevenson.

- The need to implement a new Health Information System is vital because Stevenson's old electronic health system will soon become decommissioned in Canada and there are no updates being supported by the manufacturer. This makes the implementation of a new HIS system one of our most urgent needs.
- Stevenson Memorial Hospital has formed a partnership with Markham Stouffville Hospital and Southlake Regional Health Centre to implement a new HIS at all three hospital sites, enabling Stevenson to participate in the creation of a sophisticated electronic records system that would otherwise be unattainable.
- This new system is scheduled to go live at Stevenson on December 1, 2018. Bringing HIS to our hospital will transform the way that Stevenson delivers patient care, giving medical professionals improved access to patient medical data in real time, while supporting faster diagnosis and treatment.

REDEVELOPMENT – \$14M



Our community continues to show its passion for a redeveloped hospital with corporate partners and donors committing over **\$14M in received gifts and future pledges**. This includes a transformational \$10M contribution from the County of Simcoe.

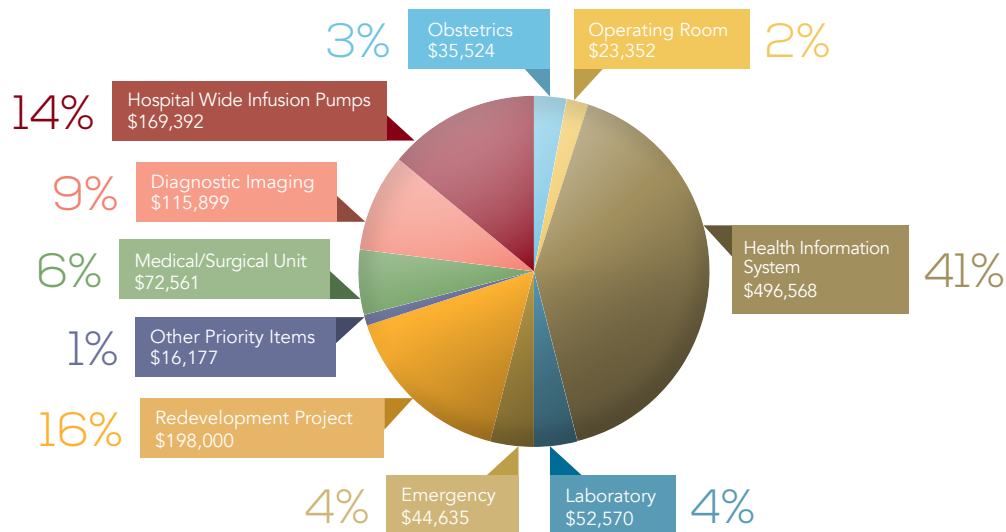

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

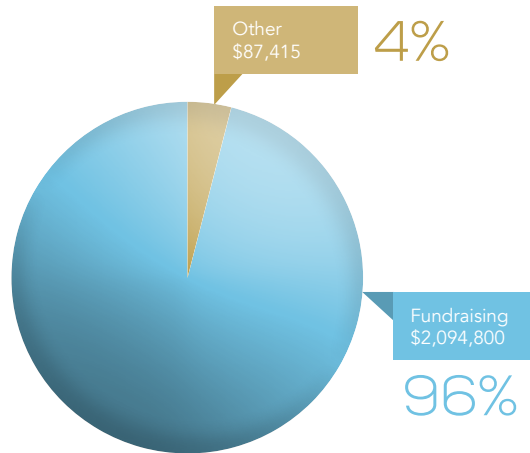
The 2017-2018 year showed significant growth for the Foundation. Total revenue was up 74% from the previous year, including a 118% increase in fundraising revenue.
