For more than two years now, we have seen the impact – both good and bad – that the coronavirus pandemic has had on our world, our way of life, and our community. While some things are out of our control, we've seen time and again that we have the capacity to drive positive impact here at home.

A Message from the President and CEO, Stevenson Memorial Hospital

As our staff continue to persevere through the pandemic and provide excellent, high quality health care services to our patients day in and day out, I am inspired by what our team was able to achieve in the 2021-22 year. As always, I am proud and privileged to be the President and CEO of Stevenson Memorial Hospital (SMH) and will highlight a few of the hospital's accomplishments over the past

An incredible amount of work and planning went into our accreditation process with Accreditation Canada in November, 2021 in which we received Exemplary Standing, the highest standing awarded. Their final report included that SMH had met 98.5 per cent of the criteria evaluated, which is an increase from 96.3 per cent of criteria met in 2016. SMH was noted to have excelled in the areas of COVID-19 pandemic management, implementation of the Health Information System (HIS - SHINE project), health information - Patient Connect portal, redevelopment progress, growth in staffing/leadership roles and overall caring committed staff, physicians and leaders.

In February, 2022 we opened a COVID-19, Cold & Flu Clinic in partnership with community physicians, providing assessments to those with mild to moderate symptoms who choose to receive in-person care. Our COVID-19 Assessment Centre continues to provide weekly COVID-19 testing services, and to date, over 36,000 swab tests have been completed by our staff. This is a service that we are proud to offer our community, and one that we know our community members are grateful to have locally.

We were pleased to have two visits by the Premier of Ontario in the past year, and in March, 2022 we received approval from the Ministry of Health on our Stage 2 proposal for a redeveloped hospital and approval to move to Stage 3 of the process.

This is the most significant milestone to date, moving the hospital one step closer to building the much-needed expansion. The completion of Stage 2 allows the hospital to begin detailed architectural design work that will finalize the layout of the new expansion and how it is integrated with the existing hospital. This will be a major step toward being able to begin construction.

I thank the community for their continued support as we work towards our hospital's redevelopment. I know that the process is a marathon, not a sprint so I appreciate all of the dedication and support throughout the journey. Donors have continued to make an impact and shown that this community is behind the project, which is so important. It couldn't be possible without you.

I will continue to keep our redevelopment project at the forefront and ensure that this community receives the expanded and revitalized hospital it deserves.



Annual Priority Needs

Your Dollars At Work

The Stevenson Memorial Hospital Foundation (SMHF) supports the needs of Stevenson Memorial Hospital (SMH) by raising funds for capital projects and equipment. Local governments rarely fund the purchase of hospital equipment, which means we depend on philanthropic donations to meet this critical demand.

In 2021/22, over \$3.5 million was raised in new cash and pledge commitments through the generous support of individuals, businesses, corporate donors and granting foundations. Funds raised supported the purchase of equipment, technology and renovations essential to both advancing patient care and the redevelopment of Stevenson Memorial.

Over \$100,000 was designated towards the remaining balance of Stevenson's four bed, Level 2 High Acuity Unit (HAU), which opened in January 2021.

Other equipment needs funded by the SMHF include a Bladder Scanner for the Emergency Room, Ultrasound Vascular Handheld Unit - Dialysis Department, Automated External Defibrillator for the Ambulatory Care Clinic, Blanket Warmers, Incident and Patient Feedback Database Interfaced to Meditech (Datix) and many other infrastructure and

Canadian Tire Alliston

Without a strong community to partner with, the Because of you, we can Campaign would not be possible. For many years, one of our strongest community partners has been the Canadian Tire in Alliston.

Not only has Canadian Tire
Alliston been supporting SMHF
since 2006 – raising more than
\$40,000 in the process – but
they decided to engage the
community in an event that
has already seen success at
another Canadian Tire location in
Saskatchewan: Toffifee.

Community residents were challenged with buying enough boxes of the tasty treats to purchase an entire tower, which amounted to more than 2,000 boxes of Toffifee! Just sourcing that amount of Toffifee was difficult, much less selling it all in a short period of time.

But, with a supportive, caring community and motivated employees, more than 2,100 boxes were sold, resulting in a \$5,000 gift.

Canadian Tire Alliston owner Brad O'Neill said that the challenge took some time to gain its legs, but a push from SMHF's social media that challenged the community to topple the tower, it took off. Combined with in-store promotion and signs, the Toffifee tower never stood a chance.

O'Neill said that he has "been in communities where there isn't a hospital and people have had to drive considerable distances to receive any kind of health care. And I don't think we really realize just how fortunate we are to have a hospital in our in our community."

That's why O'Neill and his store took up the challenge. "So, in order for things like that to stay, we've got to help them do our part," he said. "To do our fundraising so we can see the hospital grow and continue to improve."

As we partner with businesses and individuals in our community, we are getting closer and closer to the \$43 million goal for our Because of you, we can Campaign. And it's these kinds of partners – partners like Brad and Canadian Tire – that give this Campaign its name.

With a community like this, we know that we can transform Stevenson and continue delivering exceptional health care, close to home.
