Message from Our Leaders The Success of our Community Hospital is Because of You!

If you've read any of our newsletters or followed us on social media, you've probably seen us use the word "community" a lot. It's not a complicated word, but here at Stevenson Memorial Hospital Foundation (SMHF), it's a word that means a lot.

Community includes the doctors, nurses, administrative staff, paramedics, health care providers, and everyone who comes into the hospital every day to provide world-class healthcare.

It includes the volunteers who selflessly give their time to assist those who need it most at Stevenson Memorial Hospital.

And community includes all the donors and supporters who make our work at the Foundation possible.

You might not know this, but SMHF relies solely on individuals, families, foundations, and organizations to fund upgrades to our equipment and purchase new tools. That means donors like you have, in some way, assisted each of the **114,050 patients** who came to Stevenson Memorial Hospital last year.

What does that look like? Last year, it was **34,534** emergency department visits, **12,718** inpatient days, and **4,234** surgical procedures at Stevenson. Not only that, but we also welcomed **566** new faces to our community here in New Tecumseth.

All of that was only made possible because supporters like you donated more than **\$3.5 million** last year. Incredibly, that helped us fulfill a matching gift of **\$1 million** from The Morningview Foundation, further increasing the impact of each donation.

And your impact is real. Because of your support, our **Because of you, we can** Campaign has now surpassed **70% of our \$43 million goal** of Transforming Stevenson. Over the past year, that has meant purchasing equipment such as new cardiac monitors, infant warmers and stretchers, and also projects such as renovating the Emergency Department workstation.

None of that would be possible without our community. So, from all of us at Stevenson Memorial Hospital Foundation, we want to extend a heartfelt thank you for making this past year possible.

The COVID-19 pandemic has eased over the past year, but the healthcare landscape has not been any less challenging. Our staff continue to provide compassionate care and high-quality services to patients, families and visitors around the clock and as a team, are here for our community. As always, I am proud and privileged to be the President and CEO of Stevenson Memorial Hospital (SMH) and will highlight some of the hospital's accomplishments over the 2022-2023 year.

We were pleased to have the Premier of Ontario visit in March of last year to announce our Stage 1.3 Functional Program (formerly Stage 2) and approval to move to Stage 2 Design and Detailed Planning (formerly Stage 3). We were thrilled to announce our appointment of Kasian Architecture as the prime consultant for Phase 1 of the redevelopment project – the new expansion, in January, 2023.

Along with Kasian, we have hit the ground running and completed a significant amount of work towards the project. Planning meetings, research, property reviews and more have been completed, and several staff and community partners have been engaged in reviewing and contributing to the design and intricate details of the new expansion. We look forward to continuing our work with Kasian

and partnering with the Capital Branch of the Ministry of Health to reach our goal of construction starting in 2025.

In February, 2023 we launched a Transitional Care Program in partnership with Riverwood Senior Living. The program provides patients no longer in need of acute health care services an opportunity to transition out of hospital and into a local retirement and shown that this community residence, where they can receive additional rehabilitative services as they await their permanent bed, either at home or in a long-term care facility. A four-bed Transitional Care Unit (TCU) is available at Riverwood Senior Living, allowing patients to stay for up to 90 days free of charge.

I thank the community for their continued support as we continue to make improvements in the hospital and work towards our hospital's redevelopment. I know that it has been many years of planning, but we are getting close to our vision becoming a reality and I look forward to sharing the new plans once they are approved.

In the meantime, the donations and support our community have provided are so critical, and I thank you for your dedication to helping the SMH Foundation reach their goal with the **Because of you**, we can Campaign. Donors have continued to make an impact is behind the project, which is so important.

Your hospital is the heart of our community. As our community grows, we need to grow with it. While Stevenson Memorial Hospital staff and physicians continue to provide high quality health care services daily, we continue to work toward a redeveloped hospital for the communities in south Simcoe and beyond.

Because of you, we have now raised over 70% of our \$43 million Campaign goal in donations and future pledges towards Stevenson's redevelopment.

Because of you, we are closer than ever to a revitalized hospital with cutting-edge equipment and comfortable, modern spaces for optimal patient care. Because of you, we can.

Here's what you can look forward to with a revitalized Stevenson Memorial Hospital:

Our Emergency Department will triple in size.

We will have a dedicated **Emergency Department** entrance.

We will have an enhanced Birthing Unit with new labour and delivery rooms, reception and family/waiting area.

We will have a much larger, newly outfitted Diagnostic Imaging Department.

We will have new bright, modern spaces for clinical areas.

Our Surgical Services Department will more than double in size.

Inpatient beds will increase from 38 to 47.

There will be dedicated access for ambulances and a new enclosed Ambulance Bay.

There will be newly enhanced parking lots for staff and visitors.

Annual Priority Needs Becoming Better Equipped to Serve You

As a community health care facility that services south Simcoe and its surrounding communities, the need to transform Stevenson is greater than ever. It's an unfortunate reality that Stevenson Memorial Hospital, like most Ontario hospitals, rarely receive funding from local governments for new equipment, despite how essential the equipment may be. That's why we rely on gifts from those within our communities. It's because of the individuals and organizations supporting us that we can continue to deliver world-class care close to home.

In 2022-23, our revenue was over \$3.5 million in donations. These gifts allowed us to purchase new equipment such as halo bassinets for our youngest patients, stretchers, and cardiac

Giving to our "Greatest Needs" means giving a gift without conditions on how it should be used. This allows us the flexibility to invest where funds are needed most to enable our medical staff to continue to improve community health care and save the lives of patients.

YOUR IMPACT: Cardiac Monitors

Cardiac monitors are a crucial tool in healthcare, particularly when it comes to patient safety. By monitoring a patient's heart rate and rhythm, healthcare professionals can quickly detect any irregularities and respond to serious complications. For patients with heart conditions, cardiac monitors can be the difference between life and death.

But it's not just patients with pre-existing heart conditions who benefit from cardiac monitors. These devices are also critical in emergency situations, like undergoing surgery or recovering from a traumatic injury. During these times, patients may be under anesthesia or sedation, which car affect heart function. By using a cardiac monitor, healthcare professionals can closely track a patient's heart rate and rhythm to ensure that everything is

YOUR IMPACT: Infant Warmers

World-class health care at Stevenson Memorial Hospital means providing the best possible care for all our patients, even those who are only a few minutes old. One of the most essential pieces of equipment in neonatal care is an infant warmer.

Infant warmers provide a stable, controlled environment that helps regulate a newborn's body temperature, preventing hypothermia and related complications.

"Since the acquisition of the new Panda Warmers, we have really noticed the positive impact they have had on our unit, specifically when used in the OR for C-Sections.

The most common impact for the medical staff in our unit is the ability to get vitals and weight of newborns in the Operating Room without having to lean under the overhead heater, while eliminating the risk of head injuries. The design also allows better access to the babies by the medical staff and parents. The ability to more easily provide oxygen (CPAP) and suction makes a huge difference."

– Jodi Walker, RN, BScN, Director of Perioperative and Maternal Child Services For premature or low-birthweight babies, maintaining body temperature can be a challenge. These warmers make it possible to provide the warmth and care these infants need to thrive.

Thanks to your support, we were able to invest in new infant warmers, meaning our medical staff improve outcomes for our youngest patients and ensure they receive the best possible start in life.


